

Place <u>Backing Fabric</u> on the back of the hoop, use temporary adhesive spray if necessary. Match <u>embroidery bobbin</u> <u>thread</u> and <u>embroidery thread</u> in the needle to your fabric. Stitch tack down.

To complete the monthly sign, remove from hoop and trim seam allowance to about χ'' using pinking shears.

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


Place the second piece of Fabric 2 right side to the block. Keeping the edges even.

Using a neutral thread, stitch the seam.

Remove pockets LPF and RPF from hoop.

Press the seam edge out, bringing the pocket lining to the inside of the pocket. The trim piece of Fabric 2 will be facing up. Leave the stabilizer inside the pocket.


Trim and baste edges of pocket to make them even, keeping with in the $\mbox{\it \%}''$ seam allowance.



Baste the two pieces together within the seam allowance of a $\mbox{\em 4}^{\prime\prime}$







Layout the finished blocks as shown. Stitch them together, taking care to match the Baby Quilting.

Press seams to one side.

Place the pony tail elastic, centering at the top seam as shown. Baste in place, keeping the elastic together.




Stitch 1



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
Changing Pad



Place the lining fabric right side to the changing pad. Pin in a few places to hold the lining smooth and flat.

With the lining facing down, and the changing pad facing up, Stitch on the basting line using a walking foot. Stitch around the entire pad, leaving an opening to turn at the bottom where the feet are.

Turn and press. Make sure your pockets are turned to the right side. Tuck in bottom and pin.



To Finish:

Using your quilting thread in the needle and the bobbin, edge stitch around the main part of the changing pad. Sections A1,A2,A3,B1,B2,AND B3. Making sure you catch in the lower part where you turned the pad. Pockets do not require topstitching.

Next: Keep the quilting thread in the bobbin, change the needle thread to MonoPoly.

Stitch in the ditch between the block on the main part of the changing pad.

Add your wipes and diaper cream, fold up the pad and determine where to sew on a cute button to hold it closed!

Stitch detail using black thread.






Stitch pacifier using light tan thread.


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
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
