





Redwork Pincushion

Redwork is the original word for outline embroidery hand sewn with Turkey red thread in the late 1800's, but the name is still used today to describe outline needlework in any color. Choose a snowflake or flower for this petite pincushion, then let your embroidery machine get the stitches just right. Instructions for a simple muslin insert are included. We recommend filling the insert with ground walnut shells to keep the pins and needles sharp.

Materials Needed:

HOOP: 4 x 4

Embroidery Field: 3.56 x 3.61" or 90.4 x 91.7 mm

Finished Size: 3¾ x 3¾"

STABILIZER: Cut-away

Fabric A: Borders and Back 1 Fat Sixteenth Fabric B: Background Fabric Scrap

OTHER:

BattingButton (for flower)

• Kimberbell® Paper Tape

Cutting Instructions:

Fabric A:

Outside Backing Pieces cut (2) 5×5 " Border Pieces 2 & 3 cut (2) $4\frac{1}{2} \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ " cut (2) $4\frac{1}{2} \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ "

Fabric B:

Background Piece 1 $cut (1) 3\% \times 3\%$ "

Pattern Key



Indicates thread color change.



(1) $5 \times 5''$

(1) 34"

Corresponds with the specific embroidery machine step.

A Fat Sixteenth is 9 x 11"

Prepare the Following:

 Take the two outside backing pieces, wrong sides together, and iron them in half



Embroidery Instructions:

Hoop stabilizer only
